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DRIVING IN SLIPPERY, SLUSHY ROAD CONDITIONS

Reduce your speed: Don't be fooled into thinking that your four-wheel drive or heavy vehicle can properly handle the slippery or wet roads at normal speed. **Don't Tailgate:** This leaves your room to react to wet or slippery conditions, reduce low visibility from road spray and the possibility of a rock into your windshield. **Gradually accelerate, brake and turn.** If you do these things suddenly on a wet or slippery road, you lose traction and could end up losing control of your vehicle. Make sure you have **plenty of windshield washer fluid** so you can always see the road. Be extra **careful driving in very windy conditions.** Don't try to continue driving if you can't see from blowing rain or snow. Pull over to the side of the road until weather conditions improve. **Avoid using your vehicle's cruise control** function in snowy, icy, or rainy weather. For safety purposes, you need to manually control the acceleration of your vehicle. **Be Safe Out There!!!**
