IMPROVEMENT DISTRICT #5 INTERIM ADVISORY COMMITTEE

TERMS OF REFERENCE

The Interim Advisory Committee is appointed until October 31, 1995 to provide recommendations regarding local governance and policy issues related to Improvement District #5 and to represent residents and ratepayers in this regard. More specifically, the terms of reference for the Committee include the following:

Provide the Minister of Environmental Protection with a recommendation for a
permanent, long-term solution to government for I.D. #5 which ensures fair
representation for the residents and ratepayers of the I.D.

This recommendation should be provided by March 31, 1995 in consideration of timelines surrounding municipal elections.

- 2. Provide recommendations regarding:
 - A. Policy issues.
 - B. General budget issues or policy.
 - C. Other matters referred by the Minister of Environmental Protection, Director of Kananaskis Country, or residents and ratepayers of I.D. #5, Such recommendations are to be normally presented to the Director of Kananaskis Country/Manager of I.D. #5, with the acknowledgment that such recommendations may also be taken directly to the Minister of Environmental Protection.
- Communicate as appropriate with residents and ratepayers;
 - A. Through special public sessions as necessary.
 - B. Through minutes, etc. advising of decisions or requesting input.
 - C. To establish, assess and prioritize issues as identified by ratepayers and residents of I.D. #5.
- Receive oral or written presentations from individuals or groups related to the areas outlined above. No public hearings will be entertained by the Committee.
- 5. The rules of the Committee should be in accordance with the Roberts Rules.
- 6. Quorum for meetings and decisions shall be four.

INTERIM ADVISORY COMMITTEE RECOMMENDATION POR LONG TERM GOVERNANCE OF IMPROVEMENT DISTRICT NO. 5

RECOMMENDATION: It is recommended that the Minister of Municipal Affairs recommend to the Lieutenant Governor in Council, that a new Improvement District be formed to replace I.D. #5.

> The boundaries of the new Improvement District will coincide exactly with the boundaries of Kananaskis Country.

> The new improvement District will officially be called Kananaskis Improvement District (K.I.D.).

PURPOSE:

The main objective is to streamline and make more efficient the administration of the area and provide meaningful local representation.

The area serves the year round needs of visitors, both Albertans, and others. A sizeable local permanent population cannot develop within the area.

The K.I.D. Council will provide ratepayers and residents a .neans of dealing with local issues, and of having meaningful input Into the management of Kananaskis Country.

COUNCIL:

The K.I.D. Council will be made up of seven members selected as follows:

- A) Four mambers will be selected from the local ratepayers and residents as follows:
 - One member representing ratepayers from the Lower Kananaskis
 Lake cabin area.
 - 2) One member representing non commercial residents.
 - One member representing businesses employing 50 or more people.
 - One member representing businesses employing 48 or less people.
- B) Three members selected from Albertans at large and appointed by the Minister of Municipal Affairs.

The Chairperson will be selected from among the four local members based on the majority support from the whole membership of Council.

It is recommended that representation be reviewed in three years.

Meeting schedule will be determined by the Council. All meetings are open to the public. Compensation for the Council members will be in keeping with gevernment policy. The four Kananaskis ratepayer and resident council members will be remunerated by the K.I.D.. The Albertan 'at large' council members will be remunerated from Alberta government general revenue.

SELECTION PROCESS:

The residents and ratepayers of K.I.D. are limited in numbers and are composed largely of seasonal employees and non-resident ratepayers. The Provincial election process is not likely to give proper representation to these groups.

Therefore the following procedure is recommended.

- Members representing local ratepayers and residents will be chosen by and within each representative sector.
- B) Members representing the citizens of Alberta will be selected from replies to applications circulated throughout Alberta.

OPERATIONS:

The operation of the K.I.D. will be the responsibility of the seven member K.I.D. Council. They will work in conjunction with the Kananaskis Country Manager, who will be responsible for the Kananaskis Country, and Kananaskis Improvement District daily operations. The K.C. Manager will sit as an ex-officio member of the K.I.D. Council.

The existing improvement District Office in the Kananaskis Village Centre will continue as the future K.I.D. Office.

K.I.D. Budget Committee:

The four members of Council, representing the local residents and ratepayers, will form the K.I.D. Budget Committee. They will be responsible for the K.I.D. property assessment, assessment notices, tax rolls, and tax notices. They will prepare the annual operating and capital budgets for K.I.D., for the approval by the Minister of Municipal Affairs. K.I.D. budgets will be co-ordinated with K.C. budgets to ensure fair cost sharing on Items of mutual concern.

PLANNING & DEVELOPMENT:


The K.I.D. Council will have an advisory role in Municipal Planning and Development Approval.

TIMING:

The Kananaskis, Improvement District Council will have a three year term commencing in the Fall of 1995. It will be selected and in place to coincide with the Provincial Municipal Elections.

SUMMARY

KANANASKIS IMPROVEMENT DISTRICT COUNCIL TERMS OF REFERENCE

- 1. Term 3 years commencing in the Fall of 1995.
- 2. Council will be involved in all major policy decisions for the area.
- 3. The K.I.D. Budget Committee will represent local ratepayers in all budget matters.
- 4. The K.i.D. Council will have representation on the Kananaskis Country interdepartmental Committee to the extent of supplying 1/3 of the K.C.I.C. total membership.
- 5. The K.I.D. annual budget will be fully co-ordinated with the K.C. budget on matters of mutual concern.
- 6. Consideration will be given to seeking agreement by the Minister of Municipal Affairs, that the K.I.D. Council report exclusively to the Minister of Environmental Protection. Meetings with the Minister will be held on a regular basis.
- 7. Communication with residents and ratepayers will follow a defined schedule.
- 5. Robert's Rules will be followed for all Council matters.
- 9. A quorum will consist of 4 council members.

RE: Improvement District #5 Governance Model

Your letter of Suptember 22, 1995, was gratefully received and was reviewed with the interim Advisory Committee at our September 25, 1995 meeting. The following answers to your queries reflect the result of the committee's discussion of each flort. The government model we propose should be reevaluated in the Spring of 1996, to assess its effectiveness over its first term, allowing time for any dealred changes to be made prior to the selection of a new optimal.

Honourable Tom Thurber's Queries

A) Areas of responsibility for I. D. Council:

1. Preparation of Operating/Capital Budgets

- 2. Street Lighting 3. Municipal Capital Works
- 4. Assessment
- S. Tex Red
- 6. Assessment Review Board
- 7. Municipal Planning (advisory input to Kananasids Country through K.C.I.C.)
- 8. Development Approvate (achieory input to Kenansalde Country through K.C.I.C.)
- 9. Sylaw Development and Enforcement (I.D. Orders will be utilized through the Minister of Municipal Affairs)
 10 Seriety Codes (Fire related only)
 11.Requisitions

- 12.Legal (Department of Municipal Affairs)
 13.Council Selection (I.D. recommends, Municipal Affairs approves)
- 14 M.E.P. (Secondary responsibility for I.D. #5, primary responsibility K.C.)
- 15. Fire Bignitice (Primary for ratebayers and residents of I.D. #5 with some advantage to K.G.)
- 18. Ambulance Service (K.C. will be responsible for a portion of the service)
- 17 Garbage Collection (Operational Support from Environmental Protection) 18.8 mage Disposal and Water (E.P. provides project management, necessary inspections and traces for related repairs. I.D. 85 is responsible for purchasing equipment and supplies necessary to repair that portion of the system servicing the left. Kidd R. V. Park and the golf course subdivision. Sewage treatment, waterines and distribution would remain the primary responsibility of A.P.W.S.S.)
- 19. Weed Control (Inspection)
 20. Muniopal Administration (I.O. Manager to continue to be provided through E.P.)

21. Roads (Transportation and Utilities)
22. Drainage / Flood Control (Environmental Protection)

- B) Ministerial Order can be used to change name ato.: committee agrees
- C) Remuneration:

The committee recognizes the obligation of the LD, to best the cost of the four council members salected from the residence and relegation of the area. The two provincial appointment to K.C.I.C. and the council will be paid by the province. (See also "E" below)

- D) 1.0. #5 Council reporting responsibilities;
 The committee tests that for at least its Initial term, the new council would benefit from involvement with both the Department of Municipal Affairs and the Department of Environmental Protection.
- E) Council Size:

The committee agrees with the proposal that the new council be limited to six members. Four will be nominated by the residents and retepayers, and exproved by the appropriate Minister. Two members will be drawn from the current citizen members (Albertains at large) of the K.C.I.C. They will be the Ministers representatives on the proposed Kananastas Improvement District (K.I.D.) Council. The challman for the sound! will be selected from the four area representatives and will vote only to break deadlocks. Two of the four area reps. will be appointed to the K.C.I.C.

Honourable Ty Lund's Queries

- A) Municipal responsibilities:
- B) Purposa:

The majority of residents and business operators in I.D.#5 support recreational solivities in Kenanaskis Country, creating a unique and close relationship between K.C. and I.D.#5. Although two separate budgets are prepared by I.D.#6 and K.C., most municipal services are shared. To insure adultable treatment, these shared frame must be the subject of discussion.

- C) Council and Council Selection: Bas "C" and "E" above.
- D) Operations:

The operational procedures and management currently in place, provide satisfactory sentee to 1.0.85.

E) K.G.L.G. Membership:

The committee endowers the proposal that the two public members of K.C.I.C. become members of the K.I.D. Council. In addition, two other council members will be nominated to K.C.I.C.

F) Exclusive Reporting.

The committee agrees that regular meetings with the Ministers could be too time pensumble and support the idea of an ennual meeting.

In addition to the above, I would like to make you aware of the committee's position on the question of continuing past the and of the agreed upon October 31, 1985 term.

- All members recognize that it is very unlikely that the new council will be in place by the agreed date of October 31, 1995. Since some of the members of the Interim Advisory Committee cannot serve past December 31, 1995, the group feels that all efforts must be made to complete their assignment by year end.
- The Interim Advisory Committee feets that they are entitled to an honorerium for any meetings they attend after October \$1, 1995. The following schedule is recommended. Member / hr \$20.00 Chairman / hr \$25.00 Meet as currently provided. Travel as currently agreed.
