Like many services in Canada, Kananaskis Emergency Services employs both Call-Out Firefighters and Call-Out Communications staff to compliment the full time staff on mitigating emergency events. Applicants must live in the KID, should be reasonably fit, generally healthy with no physical impediments, have access to an operational vehicle and the time to attend weekly fire training nights. A remuneration program exists to compensate Firefighters for their time spent at training and during emergency call-outs. Interested candidates are welcomed to apply to the Duty Officer at the Emergency Centre between the hours of 8:30 to 4:30 pm.

Since 1986, the Kananaskis Valley has been served with a combination full time / call out firefighter program. Operated by the Kananaskis Improvement District (KID) the service is mandated to answer emergency 911 calls and provide immediate fire / rescue response and dispatch services to our community. This is accomplished with a dedicated staff of 6 full time and 20 Call out Firefighters. With call out firefighters living with-in the Kananaskis Improvement District this dependable community service is provided 24 hours a day.
